Community Service at Logan Elm Schools



At Logan Elm, we believe that understanding our role as a part of a larger community is an important lesson for our students. The following is a list of some of the ways our students have supported the community during the first semester.

Logan Elm HS

The National Honor Society, along with Mr. Forte's and Mrs. Brison's classes, collected food and toiletry items for PICCA's Emergency Clearinghouse Food Pantry. They collected over 3000 items.

NHS, FCA, along with Mrs. Brison and Mr. Forte classes are collecting donations for local

children for the holidays.

Key Club hosted a Blood Drive in cooperation with the American Red Cross.

LEHS Student Union is collecting toys for PICCA's Toys for Tots campaign. Earlier, they also collected food for the Veterans Food Bank of the Military Resource Center.

Art Club students offered face painting at the Pickaway fall carnival and the Laurelville Holiday party; created a mural on the walls at Circleville Nutrition, made Christmas Cards for the kids and families at the Ronald McDonald house, created a mural on the walls at the Roundtown Players, and made Christmas Cards for the elderly at a local Nursing Home.

Closing and Two Hour Delay

Early Release

Occasionally, winter weather systems will move into the area after students have arrived at school. In the event that hazardous road conditions are predicted to occur later in the day, Logan Elm Schools may release students early.

On days when winter weather occurs after school has started, please check the District's website and Twitter account for messages regarding early release of students. Announcements will also be made via the One Call Now messaging system, Columbus television stations and local radio stations.
